I AM learning a lot today!





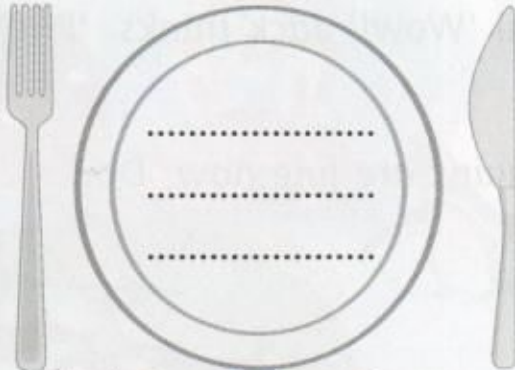

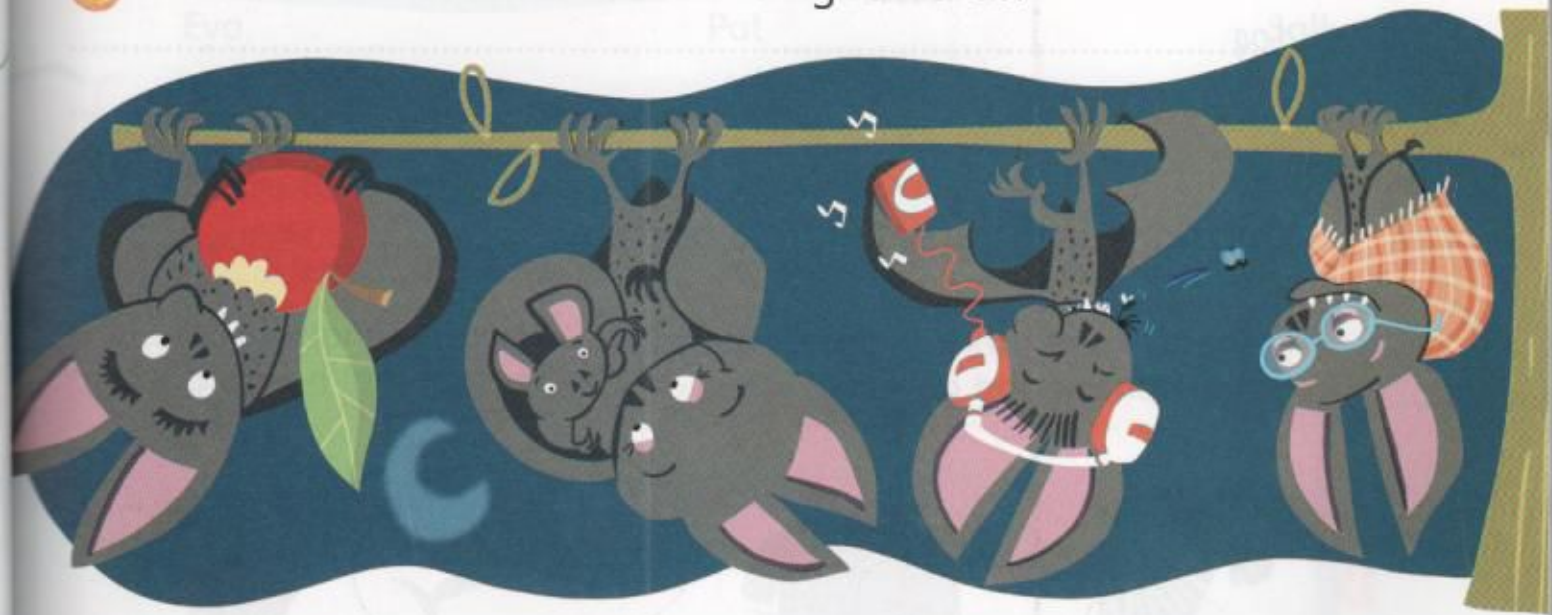

'Good morning!' answers Jog. 'Shall I get you some beans?'

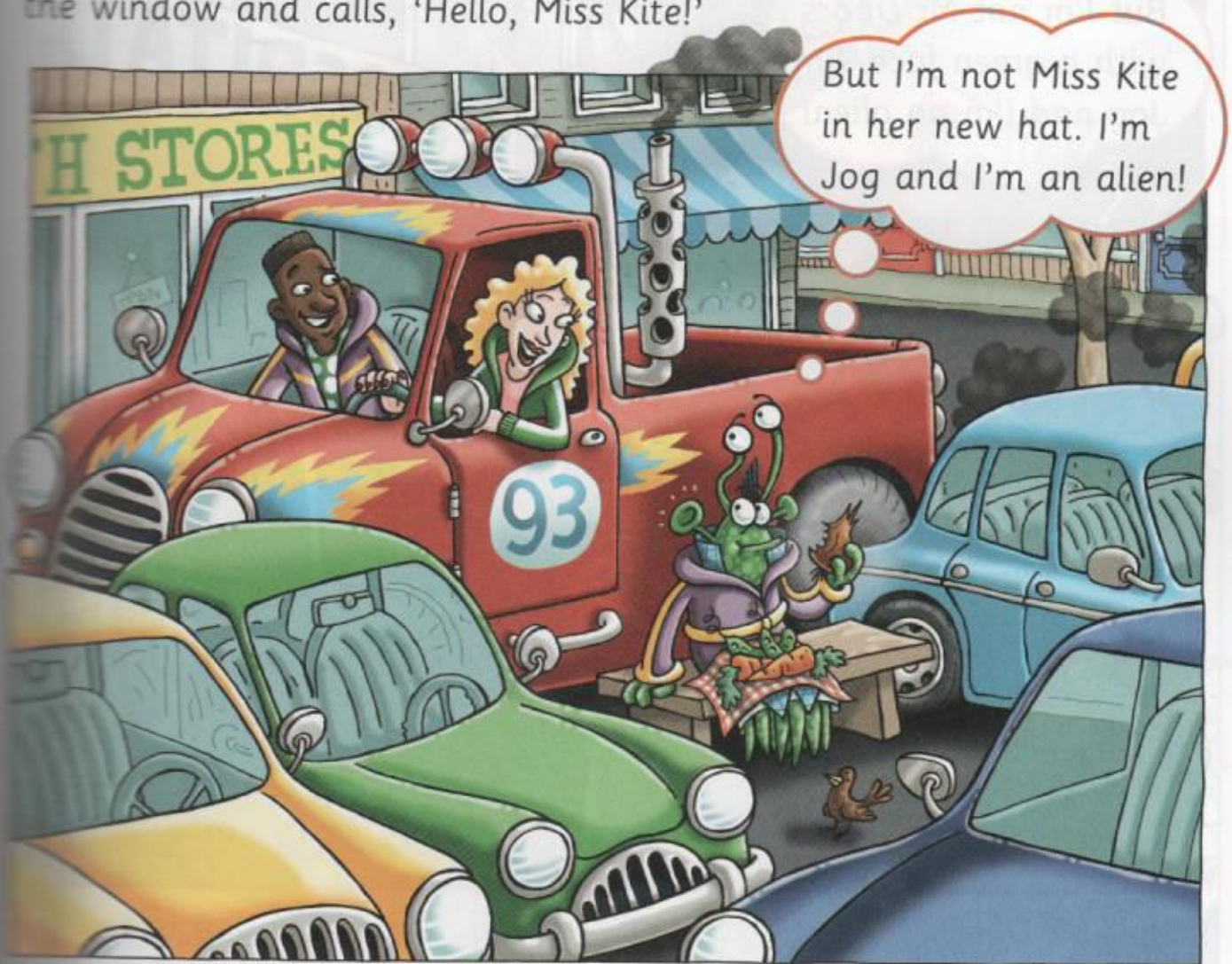
'No, thanks!' Mr Doors answers.

'Are you all right, Zoe?' Mr Hop asks.

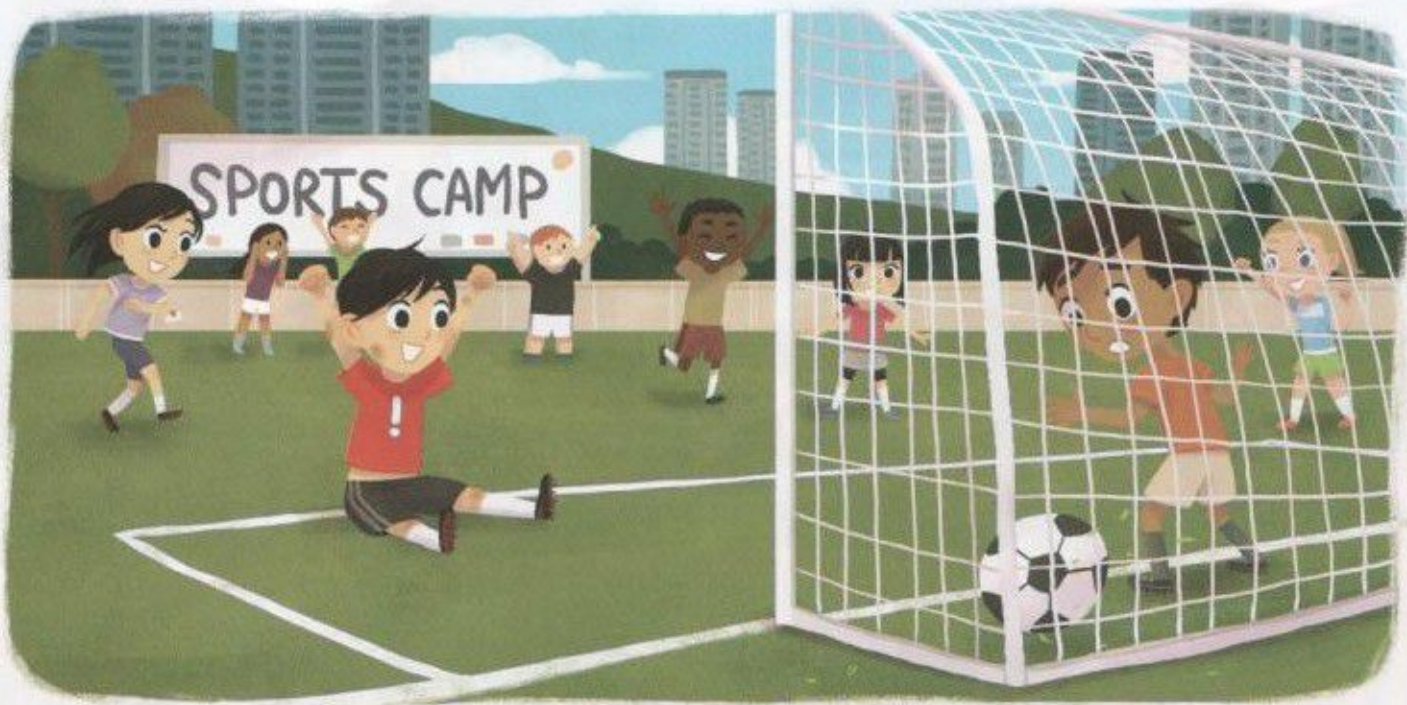
'She's fine! Don't worry!' laughs Tom.

'What about skateboarding and dancing?' asks Zoe.

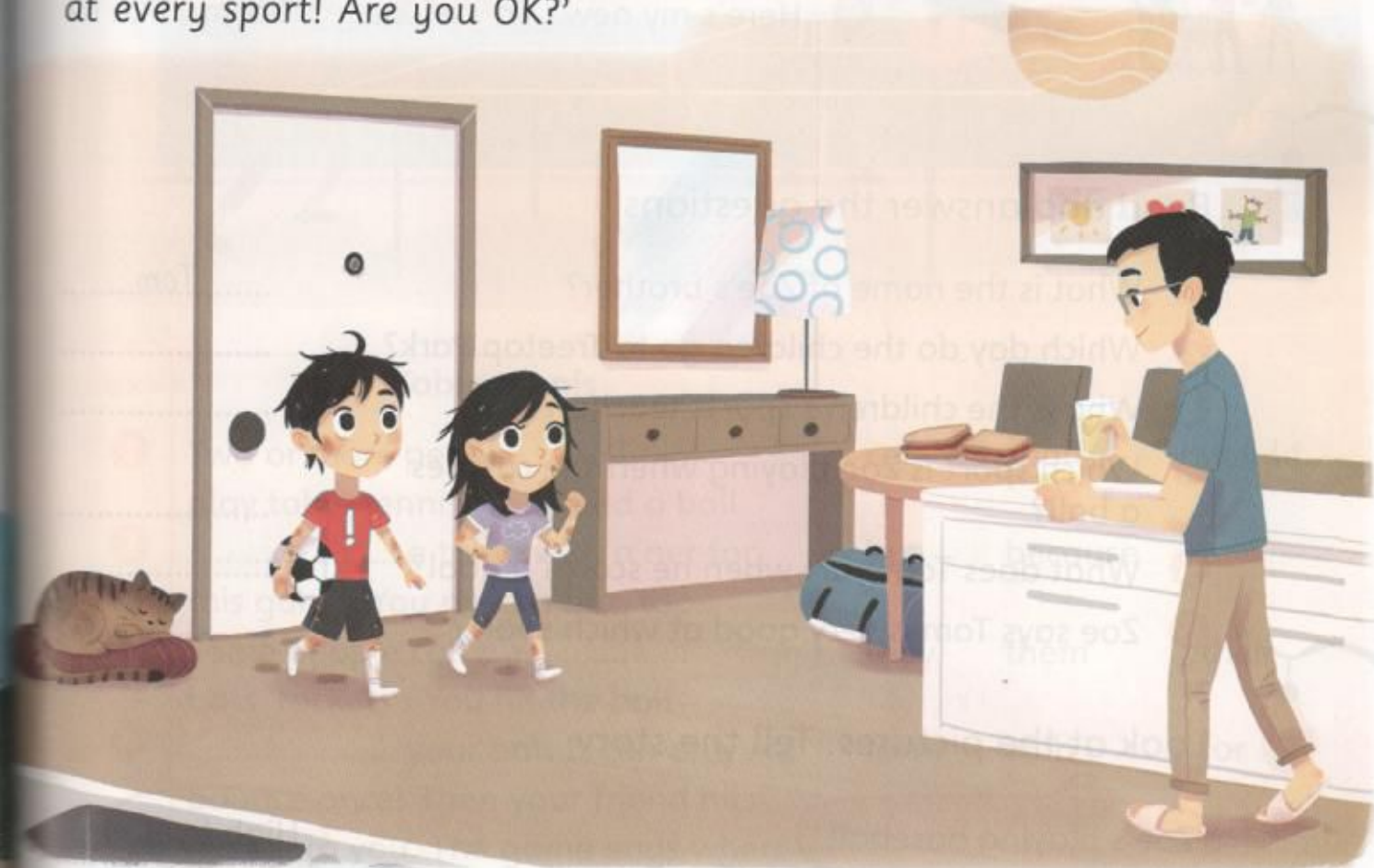

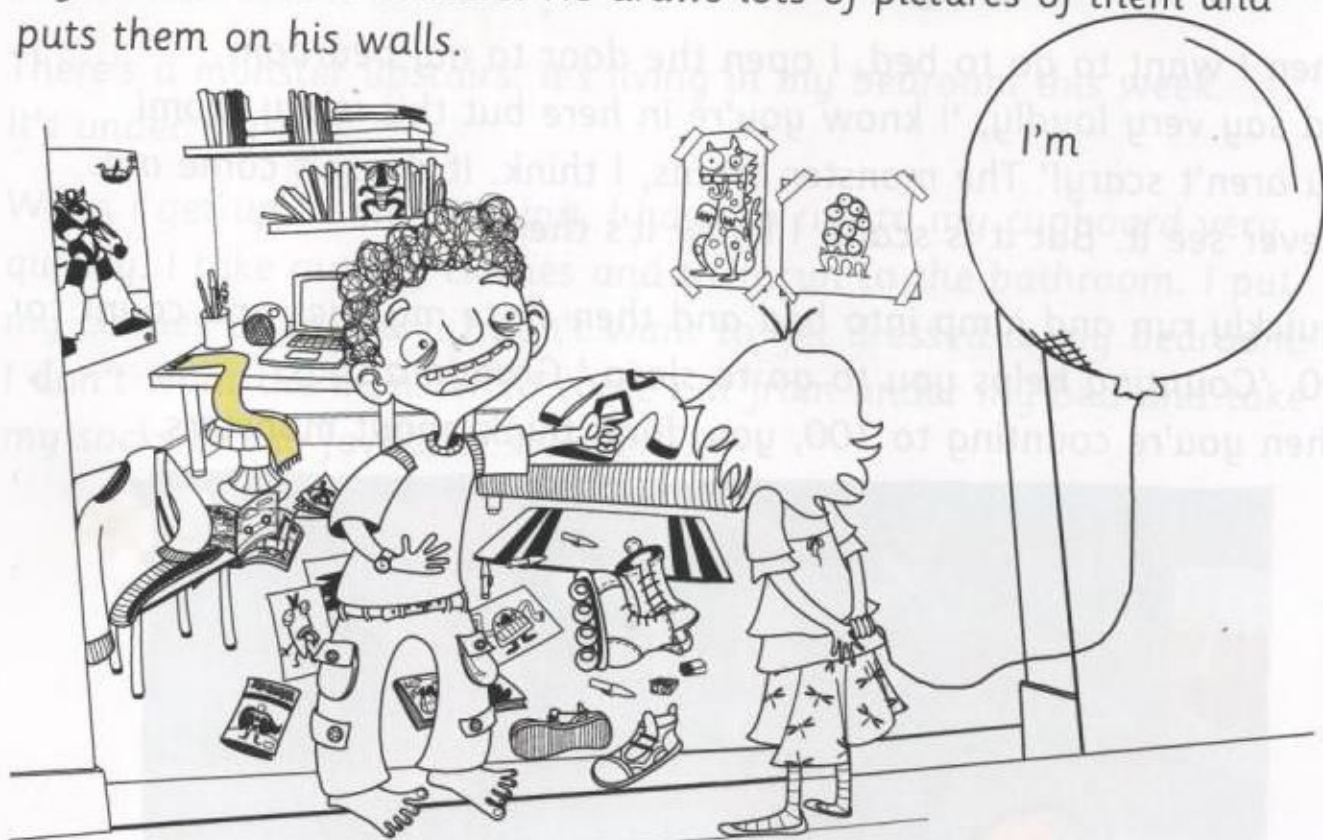

It's Saturday today. My brother and my parents don't want to help me, but I don't want to live with this scary monster for another week. I want to play computer games in my bedroom again.



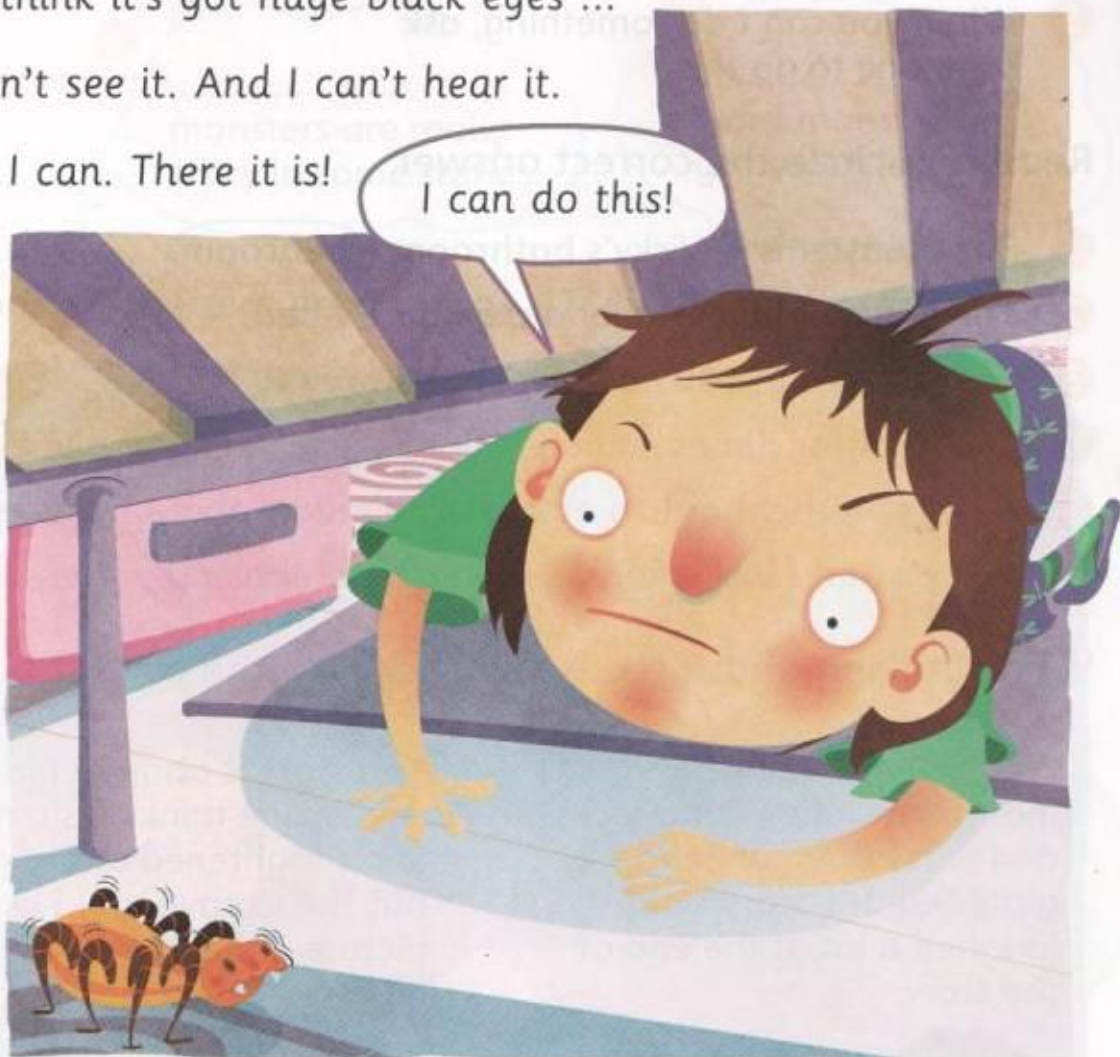
