Can I get a burger for the bats, some juice for the giraffes, some cheese for the zebras and some kiwis for the kangaroos now, please?'













'Do they? Wow!' says Jack!



'Good morning!' answers Jog. 'Shall I get you some beans?'


'No, thanks!' Mr Doors answers.

Sam and his sister, Julia, live in Skiptown. They're riding in the yellow spaceship. Sam sees Jog and points to him.





But ... I can't find my homework.'




It's Saturday today. My brother and my parents don't want to help me, but I don't want to live with this scary monster for another week. I want to play computer games in my bedroom again.

'Have you got stomach-ache? My brother gets stomach-ache sometimes when he eats too many mangoes.'


'A stomach-ache? Oh, no! My stomach is fine, thank you,' answered the old man.


'Have you got a headache, then?'

They saw their favourite crocodile's head above the water and three little fish came and started swimming here and there, here and there, again.









'The weather's terrible, Mum!' he called. 'It's cold and windy!' 'OK,' she said.


Then it started to rain. 'Please snow too!' Henry thought. 'I want to go home!'
